ARTC

URANQUINTY LEEVE UPDATE

Andrew Mason from WWCC and Andrew Morris from RHDHV presented information to those present. Only seven members of the Uranquinty community attended, and although we had a save-the-date advertised, we didn't receive the flyer from Council until 48 hours prior to the meeting.

Andrew Morris went over the general plan for levee bank improvements and explained that WWCC had an Adopted Recommendation that represented a 1% + Freeboard option. Each of the levee banks is dealt with according to its own needs as follows:

Connorton Street: There is a new section of the levee bank to surround a section behind the Men's Shed and Neighbourhood Centre and further down to Uranquinty Street to allow for future housing. It will be built to 1.2m, and Key Street intersection will be raised in line with this.

Deane Street: Will have a 1.2m levee built to the side of the road with modification to the road ending to form part of the levee.

Levee Bank South: (Deane Street to road bridge) Some areas raised up to 600ml higher, with a leveling effect over the rest.

Levee Bank North: (Rail Bridge to Uranquinty Cross Road) Some areas raised up to 300 ml, with a leveling effect over the rest.

Churches Plain Levee: this will be raised by 600ml and the road raised at the road crossing and the levee extending to the rail line.

A number of issues were raised and discussions took place during the presentation including: the gap between the road and rail bridges, the end of Deane Street, flood gate replacement at Ryan and Baker Streets, water trapped behind the levee, different flows and causes of flooding. The Final Draft will be prepared by June 2026 and will be used for grant funding applications for both State and Federal monies to fund the project.

There is significant competition for funding, and different sections may be prioritised for completion.

AIDER

ASSISTANCE FOR INFIRM, DISABLED AND ELDERLY RESIDENTS

What is AIDER?
AIDER is a one-off free service provided to infirm, disabled and elderly residents who live in bush fire prone land, to better prepare their properties for bush fire, in conjunction with the development of a bush fire survival plan.

Who is eligible?
Those who live in bush fire prone land, and who are infirm, disabled, or elderly.

AIDER services may include:

- ▶ trimming vegetation
- ▶ removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches
- ▶ trimming branches from around and overhanging the home
- ▶ mowing or slashing long grass
- ▶ cleaning gutters

An assessment of your property will be completed by NSW RFS staff. Assistance can be provided to complete a Bush Fire Survival Plan. All works are completed by NSW RFS Mitigation crews.

New station

Unfortunately, we have been advised that the funding for our new station was not approved in the budget. This is a devastating blow for our brigade, but more so for our community as this means it'll be sometime before our station is issued and trained in the use of breathing apparatus. Members of the public can expect BA crews to attend structural fires in and around Uranquinty with us, but they'll be at least 20 minutes away from time of call.

We believe this is totally unacceptable and risks the lives of the community and our crew. *We ask the community to make their concerns known and to advocate for our new station by ringing or emailing Mr Joe McGirr.*

URANQUINTY COMMUNITY SAFETY GROUP

In the event of an emergency, we are notified by the SES of the nature of the emergency and advised what action the group is to take.

We continue our close liaison with the SES, particularly in respect to the current weather situation. Our main focus is on early warning and assisting those in need.

Emergency equipment has been supplied by the SES and is located in a container within the Men's Shed grounds. Sand for sandbagging, should it be required in a rain event, is also available at the Men's Shed.

We have received a grant to construct an all-weather shelter for filled sandbags and other equipment and outdoor lighting for the sandbagging area. Work will start shortly on this.

In the near future an evening is to be organised to show the facilities and function of the UCSG particularly for newcomers to Uranquinty.

Uranquinty Power Station is owned and operated by Origin Energy. The station comprises four gas turbines with a total generating capacity of 640-megawatts (MW).



Uranquinty Power Station Update:

Since arriving at Uranquinty Power Station nine weeks ago, I have enjoyed working alongside the crew and getting to know the plant operations. With more than 20 years' experience at Eraring coal-fired power station on Lake Macquarie, I was surprised by the number of similarities between the two sites.

While UPS operates very differently as a gas-fired peaking plant, the Origin principles and practices for how we manage the asset and work on site remain the same. The focus on readiness, reliability and supporting safe operations carries across all sites.

During my time here we have also welcomed some additional assistance from our colleagues at Eraring. Their support has been a great help to the team, and visiting the region has been a memorable experience for them. They have all commented on how much they enjoyed their time working here.

The battery energy storage system at Eraring came online at the end of January, and since then we have seen fewer generation runs at Uranquinty as the battery is able to respond quickly to short periods of demand on the electricity grid.

Recently we have been undertaking surveys and engineering reviews for the exhaust stack baffle replacement and upgrade project. This work is aimed at reducing the running noise of the plant and improving the overall operating environment for the surrounding area.

With the Easter long weekend approaching, the UPS team would like to wish everyone in the community a safe and enjoyable break. We hope it's a great opportunity to spend time with family and friends.

URANQUINTY TO KYWONG BRANCH LINE – AND THE URANQUINTY CONNECTION

The idea of building a railway line from Uranquinty towards Moon's Siding on the Narrandera to Jerilderie line was first discussed by the Dept of Public Works in September 1919. Official evidence at this time indicated that the proposed line would service a large tract of valuable country between the Murrumbidgee River and the existing Great Southern line.

Uranquinty was to be the Junction for this line as it was 6 miles shorter than branching at



Wagga Wagga and it would avoid the surrounding hills and possible flooding. In January 1926 the Minister for Railways, Mr Flannery, announced that construction would commence within the month using the railway construction plant from the recently completed line between The Rock and Pulletop at a cost of 331,000 pounds.

On 6 March 1926, a Parliamentary party arrived in Wagga Wagga and motored to Kwyong, where the ceremony of turning the first sod of the new line took place. Afterwards a banquet was held when nearly 400 people sat down in the Kwyong Hall.

During the construction phase a camp was set up on the outskirts of Uranquinty, just over the creek on the Uranquinty Cross Road. It was during this time that the village was at its wildest, the navies were always fighting and brawling amongst themselves which could be widely heard.

During one of these brawls, Constable Wardell was

knocked to the ground; on getting to his feet he drew his revolver and shot a man in the stomach. The man was taken to Wagga Wagga by train and recovered in hospital.

The line was opened to Galore in 1928 and to Kwyong in March 1929. Stations along the way included Collingullie, Belfrayden and Arajoel .

A mixed train provided passenger and goods services until 1957, when passenger services were superseded by a goods train with passenger accommodation in the guard's van. As well as these services, grain trains transported many thousands of tonnes of wheat from the silos at each station back to Uranquinty.

During the Second World War, when the Uranquinty Air Force base was operational, it has been revealed that another passenger service ran four nights a week from Wagga through to Collingullie and returning very late at night. The reasoning for this service appears to include a very short stop just outside the boundary of the base. Some of the recruits and staff recalled walking across a paddock to catch the train, mainly during the day to travel to Wagga Wagga. So the mystery still remains as to why these trains stopped just outside the boundary of the base around midnight 4 nights a week.

Passenger services were suspended in March 1965, and all services ceased in January 1987. Despite a large rally in July 1988 by local farmers, who relied on the line to transport their wheat, the SRA began removing sleepers from the line making it unusable.

DID YOU KNOW? SANDY CREEK BRIDGE

This bridge over Sandy Creek on the Mangoplah Road is the oldest reinforced concrete bridge in New South Wales.

The bridge was built in 1913 and designed and built by Mr F.N. Oxley, the grandson of John Oxley, the Australian explorer.

He was the first engineer to design and build a reinforced concrete bridge in New South Wales which was named the Coloboralli bridge.

Frederick Oxley was a skilled draftsman and engineer who came to the area in 1906 and became the engineer for both Mitchell and Kyeamba shires.

In 1920 the Government decided that each shire should have its own engineer and he continued working for Kyeamba shire.

When he retired in 1937 the shire renamed the bridge the Oxley Bridge in his honour.

Other Government and local shires had obtained the design and specifications of the bridge for use in other parts of the State.



THE MACHINE GUN TROPHY THAT WAS

On 30 March, 1921, a German machine gun trophy was unveiled at the original Uranquinty Hall in King Street. It had been captured by the 20th Australian Infantry Battalion at Warfusee, Abancourt in France on the morning of August 8, 1918.

The Wagga Daily Advertiser reported on 31 March: 'The ceremony of unveiling the German machine gun trophy took place yesterday, a good crowd of visitors being present. The gun which was hung in the Uranquinty Hall was draped with the Union Jack, while the hall was suitably decorated with flags of the different nations and the colours of the different battalions to which the Uranquinty soldiers belonged.

'Mr TH Lang presided and was supported by Messrs Meehie and Aldis. Mrs W Ford in a few well chosen words, unveiled the gun.

'Uranquinty is to be complimented on being one of the first places in the district to unveil a war trophy. A fine roll of honour was also in view, donated by Mrs W Ford, who had three sons who enlisted, one making the supreme sacrifice. In all Uranquinty's share of soldiers compared favourably with most places on a population basis, and those who made the supreme sacrifice comprised about 35% of the total.

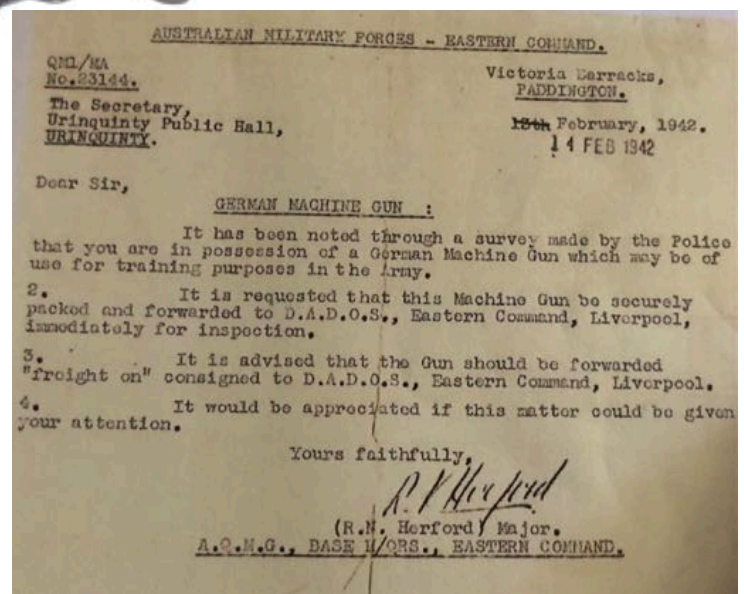
'The proceedings closed with the singing of the National Anthem, Mrs Ford acting as accompanist. Afternoon tea was dispensed and much enjoyed.'



In 1942 the hall committee was asked to return the machine gun to the Australian Military Forces for training purposes (see letter below). The only reminders that it was mounted in the old hall were two brackets above the main entrance.

These brackets were later removed and restored and now are on display in the History cupboard in the new Uranquinty Hall.
